THE THIRD ANNUAL UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO SCAVENGER HUNT

May 11 - 14, 1989-OFFICIAL RULES

SECTION I: ELIGIBILITY AND PARTICIPATION

- 1. The University of Chicago Scavenger Hunt is open to any House, Registered Student Organization, fraternity, or sorority. The designated team leader must be a member of the House, RSO, or Greek organization entered. Anyone may participate in the hunt, except for team member performance items as covered below.
- 2. The Designated Team Leader is the sole representative of the Team. No one else may speak for the team except when directed by an Official Judge.
- 3. The Designated Team Leader is responsible for insuring that the team conforms to all rules listed here and any request made by the judges.

SECTION II: THE SCAVENGER HUNT TIMETABLE:

- 1. At 12:00 noon Thursday, May 11, two copies of the list of items will be delivered to the College Mail Folder of every Designated Team Leader. At that time, teams are free to begin hunting for items on the list.
- 2. On Sunday, May 14, between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon ONLY, teams must bring their items to Ida Noyes Hall, 1212 E. 59th, for counting. After 12:00, no item brought to Ida Noyes will be counted.
- 3. Counting will take the better part of the afternoon. There will be a complimentary snack served.
- 4. Results will be announced at the conclusion of the judging.

SECTION III: THE LIST

- 1. Each Designated Team Leader receives two copies of the list. One copy may be used for any purpose, but the second must be reserved for judging use, as below.
- 2. There are over 250 items on the list, all of which could be obtained legally. The Scavenger Hunt Committee STRONGLY discourages illegal behavior, and will take no responsibility for the actions of teams. Don't call us from jail. We have no sympathy.
- 3. Every item on the list, to the best knowledge of the Committee, is extant and obtainable. Every effort has been made to insure that items exist, however, the Committee makes no guarantee that every item can be found.
- 4. There are several items which require the participation of team members. (e.g. Last year's "Person dressed only in balloons and string") These items must be performed by a University of Chicago student, over the age of 18, with UCID available for presentation. Sorry, gang, no baby tricks this time.

SECTION IV: THE JUDGING

1. On Sunday, May 14, at 12:00 noon exactly, the judging of items will begin. There will be a panel of judges, each judging the same items for each team. The judge will announce which items are to be judged, and at that time the Designated Team Leader must produce the clean copy of that part of the list which the

judge is to count.

- 2. The clean copy of the list may be marked in one way and one way only: Those items which the Team has procured must be highlighted neatly on the list. No item that is not highlighted will be counted. A team which has many highlighted items that it cannot produce can be penalized at the discretion of the Chief Judge.
- 3. The judge will allow a reasonable time for preparation of the items he announced he will judge. This time is not to exceed two minutes. After that time, the judge will call for each highlighted item and will expect it be produced within ten seconds. Consistent delays by a disorganized team will result in penalization by the Chief Judge. (Teams should not organize their items by throwing them in trash bags.)
- 4. Any item which matches the description of the list item will receive full credit. Teams may receive partial credit at the discretion of the judge.
- 5. An item is considered good when:

a) It meets the description, and all the words therein, of the item.

- b) If it is a question, it is correct within preset limits, (plus or minus if the question requires a numerical answer)
- c) If it is a performance item, it is performed to the judge's satisfaction according to the words on the list.
- 6. Unless otherwise noted, credit will be given for only one item per line.

SECTION V: THE JUDGES

- 1. The judge of an item has the discretion to accept or decline credit for an item.
- 2. The judge must not be interfered with. Any attempt to obstruct the judge from doing his or her duties will result in disqualification.
- 3. The judge will speak only to the Designated Team Leader regarding questions the team may have.
- 4. Protests regarding the acceptance or denial of an item will not be heard.
- 5. Other protests may be directed to the Chief Judge. The Chief Judge will hear first the protest, the counting judge's rationale, and make a ruling. This ruling is FINAL.
- 6. The participants must treat their opponents and the judges with respect. Any threatening, abusive, rude, or harassing behavior will result in disqualification.
- 7. No participant at any time may enter the Scoring Room.

SECTION VI: THE END:

- 1. At the conclusion of the judging, the results will be announced. The first place team will receive \$500, Second place, \$250, and third place \$100. Consolation prizes will be awarded to those teams which have accumulated an appointed number of points.
- 2. At the conclusion of the event, all items must be removed from Ida Noyes Hall and its premises. Any team which leaves items behind will be disqualified and any prize revoked. Teams are responsible for their areas.
